Community Unit School District 220 offers a self-funded K-12 Summer School Program. **The program is available to any public, private, or parochial student who is a legal resident in District #220.** The programs are based on opportunities to gain academic credit, receive enrichment, and explore new interests as well as helping students in need of remediation.

## General Information

### TUITION

See registration page. Students qualifying for the Free Lunch Program may have their tuition fees waived.

### BEHAVIOR

See Student Handbook for all behavior expectations and consequences.

### TRANSPORTATION

Parents are responsible for transportation to and from school.

### ATTENDANCE

Each day of the summer school course represents approximately one week in the regular school year. Therefore, regular attendance is expected. The basic responsibility for attendance lies with the student and parents. Summer vacation plans should not be scheduled during summer school.

### HEALTH FORMS

If you have already registered for the 2009-2010 school year, then your Emergency Health Card is already on file for use during summerschool. If you have not submitted your Emergency Health Card for next school year, please complete the Emergency Health Card attached to the summer school registration packet.

If you are not enrolled in CUSD 220, please provide physical exam, immunizations, and complete the Emergency Health Card.\*Please notify the Nurse if your son or daughter will be carrying an Epi-Pen or Asthma Inhaler\*

### Can students outside CUSD 220 participate?

Students who live outside of District 220 boundaries are eligible participate during the summer session. In order to register, students must be enrolled in middle school. Students must provide the name of their school and a current school ID number. Please be advised that early registration will not guarantee a seat in a class because District 220 students will be given the first chance to enroll for the courses offered. Students who live outside the district will be charged an additional \$50 for any academic course.

### What determines if a class will be cancelled?

You will be notified if a class is cancelled by June 7th. It is important to have an alternative plan if a class is cancelled. The district reserves the right to cancel any courses which do not meet enrollment requirements or if unable to secure a certified instructor.

# Course & Camp Descriptions

## 1-2. Reading

**Grades 6-8.....BMS - Prairie**

This class is for all levels of readers, regardless of student's reading level. Sixth through eighth graders will be given the opportunity to read and discuss their required summer reading novel in a small group setting. Students will also explore short stories, non-fiction articles, fiction novels and oral book presentations. Strategies such as summarization, prediction, inference, and many others will be re-taught for stronger comprehension. Students will also be given the opportunity to select their own reading materials on subjects that interest them and provide enjoyment. **Bring your summer reading novel to class daily.**

## 3-4. Writing

**Grades 6-8.....BMS - Prairie**

Students from all levels will explore expository, narrative, persuasive, poetry, and letter writing. Computer skills will also be emphasized as students improve their keyboarding, spell check, save to network, and incorporate graphics. Some light research will be introduced as well.

## 5-6. Regular Math

**Grades 6-8.....BMS - Prairie**

This class will focus on a wide variety of math skills. The class will assist students in establishing math skills in basic math concepts, and pre-algebra.

## 7-8. Upper Grade Study Skills

**Grades 6-8.....BMS - Prairie**

Instruction and practice will be given in the study skills necessary for effective learning. The areas of learning will be listening, writing, reading and note-taking using various types of reference materials and using study time efficiently.

## 9-10. Art - The Ultimate Art Experience

**Grades 6-8.....BMS - Prairie**

Sign up for this great art class where you will dabble in a little bit of everything. We will be creating hand built clay projects (glazed), Mosaic trays, Book making/ Collage Projects and Painting on Canvas Board.

## 11-12. Science Adventures

**Grades 6-8.....BMS - Prairie**

A 4 week course designed to introduce students to some general aspects of four scientific disciplines. It will provide the students a variety of experiences, from hands on lab based activities to the use of technology so we can bring the outside world into the classroom.

### Week 1 – Introduction to Physics

Students will be introduced to a variety of basic physics principles through hands on experiments, classroom demonstrations, and computer activities.

### Week 2 – Introduction to Chemistry

Students will be given examples of basic chemistry through a series of hands on experiments and computer based demonstrations.

### Week 3 – Introduction to Biology

Students will begin to explore some basic principles of biology through computer based simulations and classroom activities.

### Week 4 – Introduction to Ecology

Students will finish the course with an introduction to the world of ecology through internet exercises and an exploration of the natural areas surrounding Prairie campus.

## 13. Summer Concert Band

**Grades 6-8.....BMS - Prairie**

This class is a continuation of the district's band curriculum. Students will participate in daily full band rehearsals as well as sectionals of like-instrument groups (see Mrs. Byte for detailed schedule Rehearsals begin each morning at 10 am and continue every day (Mon.-Fri.) until the camp ends on June 30th with a 10 am concert in the BMS - Prairie campus commons. *(for complete schedule see page 8)*

## 14. Cyber-camp for the 21st Century Learner

**Grades 6-8.....BMS - Prairie**

This Cyber-camp will focus on the essential 21st century skills needed in today's tech-driven world. Students will get hands-on experience using the latest technology tools, while learning how to work collaboratively and communicate effectively. This technology camp will be a fun learning experience and is open to all computer skill levels.

## 15. Rockets Away

**Grades 6-8.....BMS - Prairie**

Using a NASA developed curriculum for middle school, students will spend the summer session learning about rocketry. We will use a variety of hands-on activities and multi-media materials to bring the history and principles of rocketry to life. This is sure to be an excellent and entertaining learning experience.

## 16. Algebra Chapters 1-6

This class is intended for students that will begin algebra in the upcoming school year, or the student that needs to reinforce the concepts they studied this past year as a 7th grader prior to working on chapters 7-12 in the upcoming school year. Students will receive an overview of the major concepts in chapters 1-6. These classes are intended to serve as effective preview or review sessions. This class is not intended to serve as a "retake" or to change math placement in the coming school year. Algebra - Chapters 7-12 on next page

## 17. Algebra Chapters 7-12

This class is intended for students that will be in 8th grade in the coming school year who have completed chapters 1-6 during the current school year and will be completing chapters 7-12 in the coming school year. Students will receive an overview of the major concepts in chapters 7-12. These classes are intended to serve as effective preview sessions or preparation sessions. This class is not intended to serve as a "retake" or to change math placement in the coming school year.

## 18-19. Drama/Theatre

**Grades 6-8.....BMS - Prairie**

This drama course is intended to teach children how to use their voice and body expressively, practice dramatic storytelling, explore creative dramatization, develop basic acting techniques, and utilize improvisational techniques. Participants will be encouraged to stretch their imaginations and activities are designed to enhance students' self-image by increasing their confidence and skill level. Participants will learn the art of collaboration, the nuances of public performance, and how to be a good audience member.

## 20-21. Teens Cook

**Grades 6-8.....BMS - Prairie**

Learn how to cook what you want to eat! This class will teach you how to prepare foods from snacks to simple meals using lots of new and delicious recipes. The course will include a field trip to a local restaurant and will incorporate healthy eating tips.

# Course & Camp Descriptions

## 22-23. Robotics

**Grades 6-8..... BMS - Prairie**

This class is for students who enjoy building with legos and want to learn how to program robots to perform specific tasks and missions. Students will work in small teams of 2-3 and will compete in a competition at the end of the summer school session.

## 24-25. Middle school preview: 6th Grade

**Grade 6..... BMS - Prairie**

Students will learn study skills and strategies for a successful start to 6th grade. They will identify and review reading and language arts skills essential for the beginning middle schooler. In addition, an introduction to varied technological tools will help them feel comfortable as they enter middle school in the fall.

## 26. English language Learners

**Grades 6-8..... BMS - Prairie**

This class is designed for middle school students who are enrolled in ELL classes and/or who are learning English language. The English language is instructed through the content areas- Language Arts, Social Science, Science, and Math. The class prepares students for course work during the academic year.

## 27-30. Camp 6th Grade - August

**Incoming 6th grade only ..... BMS - Prairie & Station**

Four sessions of fun, engaging activities to introduce students to middle school life. An opportunity to learn more about the organizational structures and how to navigate the building and lockers, as well as time to get to know other incoming 6th grade students

## 31. Girls Basketball Camp

**Grades 6-8..... BMS - Station**

Girls will explore the game of basketball while improving individual and team skills. Middle School coaches will conduct the camp.

## 32-33. Film Appreciation and Criticism

**Grades 7-8..... BMS - Prairie**

This course is designed for incoming 7th and 8th grade students who have an interest in films and/or journalism. The students will view motion pictures varying in genres, styles, and intended audience. In addition to viewing each film, students will analyze, criticize, and discuss different aspects of the films ranging from themes, use of color, use of sound, acting, cinematography, etc). This course will require critical thinking, discussion, and critical writing. Films will be rated from G - PG 13. ## 34-35. All-Time PE Favorites

**Grades 6-8..... BMS - Prairie**

How does Dodgeball, Capture the Flag, and many more of your all-time PE favorites sound to you? If you enjoy playing these games- then this course is for you! All-time PE favorites will include all of the great games and activities that you have loved over the years, plus new ones too. Whether you are an amateur, or a seasoned pro, you will have a lot of fun enhancing your skills.

## 36-37. Manipulative Math

**Grades 6-7..... BMS - Prairie**

Are you tired of all that paper-pencil work and wondering why you are doing it? Well if so, this is the Math class for you! Students will review some basic math concepts using hands on materials and interactive

technology before applying their knowledge to new everyday situations. This class is intended for incoming 6th and 7th grade students to help them brush up on some of the basics and prepare them for the upcoming school year.

## 38. Service Learning

**Grades 6-8..... BMS - Prairie**

Service Learning is a great opportunity to enhance student learning and involvement with the community. This course will involve students in meaningful activities that will allow them to gain a sense of civic responsibility by performing acts of service to benefit the local community. The students will have the opportunity to visit animal shelters, food pantries, nursing homes, and various other service agencies. Through this class, students will develop interpersonal and critical thinking skills to foster an appreciation of society's needs and how they can contribute to making their community a better place to live.

## 39. Girls Softball Camp

**Grades 6-8..... BMS - Prairie**

5-8 Softball Instructional Camp: Fundamentals and mechanics of throwing, fielding, hitting, bunting, PITCHING, and base running. PLAY softball! This class is being offered to 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th grade girls who are looking to enhance and develop their softball skills. The fundamentals and mechanics of throwing, fielding, hitting, bunting, and base running will be taught. Discussion and instruction on offensive and defensive situations will be covered as well. Bring a glove, water bottle, and any labeled, personal equipment. In addition hitting and fielding development, there will be pitching lesson available for any girls interested. Stacey Gillette, currently a starting pitcher for St Louis University will help players develop and/or improve their approach to pitching. There will be nineteen 2-hour sessions. A determination will be made at that time as to whether we have the necessary instrumentation and numbers to hold the program. Students are encouraged to register even if they will miss a few days due to vacation. In addition to summer band, **private lessons** will also be offered. When possible, these will be scheduled so as not to conflict with summer band.
