Plan Overview

- This plan emphasizes
 - in-person learning & instruction.
 - student & staff safety.
 - reducing the transmission of COVID-19.
- Phased mitigation data sources will begin with county-level data and move toward school-level data as the district is able to accumulate site-specific information.

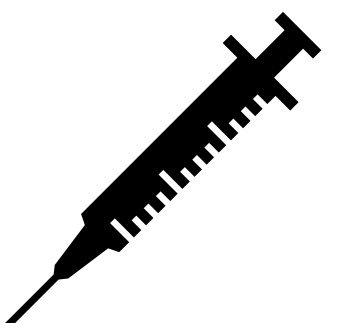
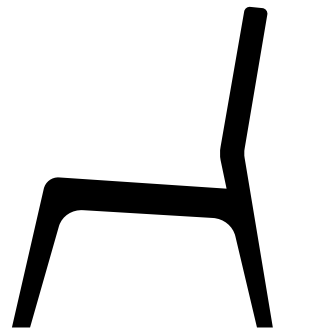
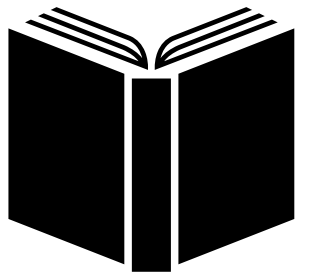
Mitigation Strategies

- All families will complete the COVID-19 symptom screening web app at home daily.
- Students will enter through a designated entrance and follow school procedures.
- Students will use hand sanitizer when they enter the building and before/after lunch/recess.
- Minimum 3-foot physical distancing will be utilized wherever possible.
- SHIELD, BinaxNow, and PCR testing.
- Improving ventilation and filtration.



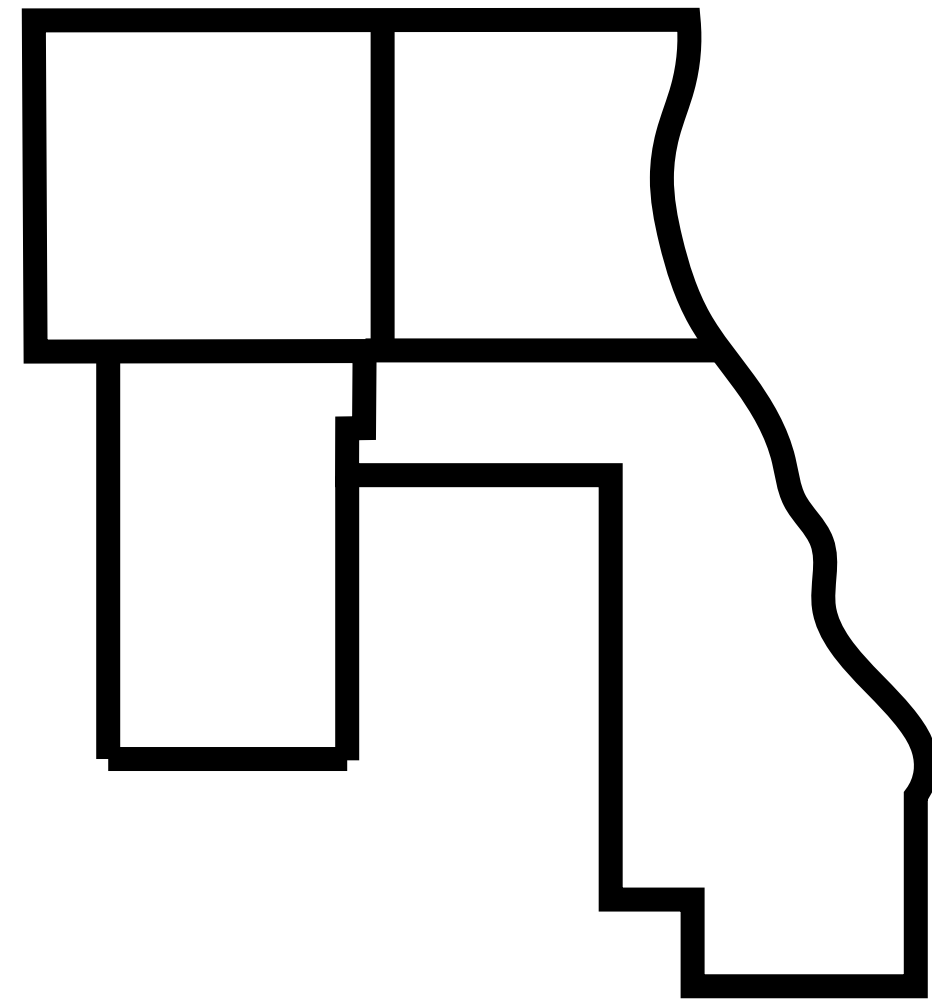
Mitigation Strategies (cont.)

- Visitors will be permitted to enter the building for educational purposes only.
- Seating charts will be maintained and seating will be assigned in cohorts for lunch (PreK-8).
- Physical education will take place outside as much as possible.
- High-touch surfaces will be cleaned at least once per day and supplies will be available for additional cleaning.
- District will request the vaccination status of all eligible students and staff.

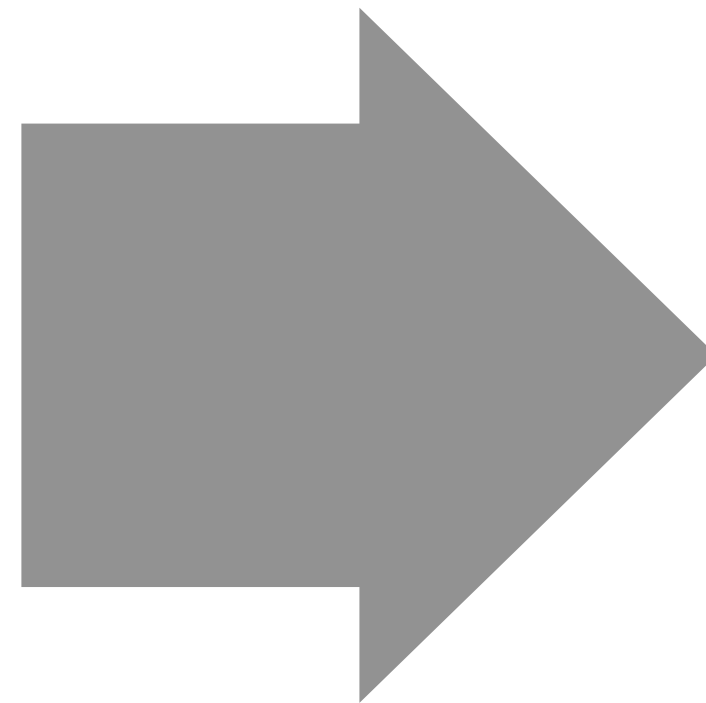


Phased Mitigation Data Sources

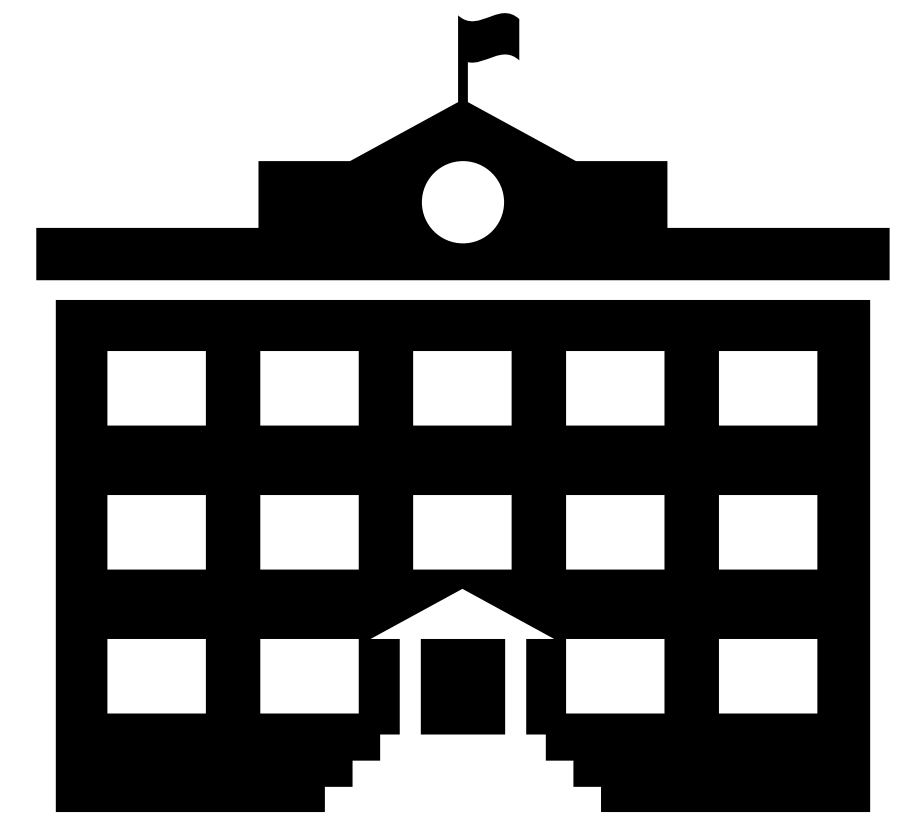

Data Sources

- Community transmission data from Northwestern Dashboard and Lake County Health Department for ZIP codes 60010, 60110, 60021, & 60192
- Vaccination rates
- Person-to-person transmission rates per building as identified through contact tracing
- Staff and students quarantined per building
- Positive cases per building (SHIELD, BinaxNow, PCR)

Definition of “Outbreak”

“An **outbreak** is defined as five or more cases that are linked to a common location during a 14-day period. These linked cases also must be from different households and not already connected from other sources. Additionally, outbreaks do not include secondary cases from those originally linked to the outbreak (e.g., person who becomes infected from their workplace and then passes the infection onto a household member).”

Masking Definitions









- **Universal Masking (UM)**
All staff, students, and visitors wear masks while indoors at all times, regardless of vaccination status.
- **Situational Masking (SM)**
Masks must be worn in shared spaces, such as hallways, and when it is not possible to social distance.
- **Recommended, Not Required, Masking (RM)**
Staff, students, and visitors choose to wear masks while indoors when mask requirements are lifted.

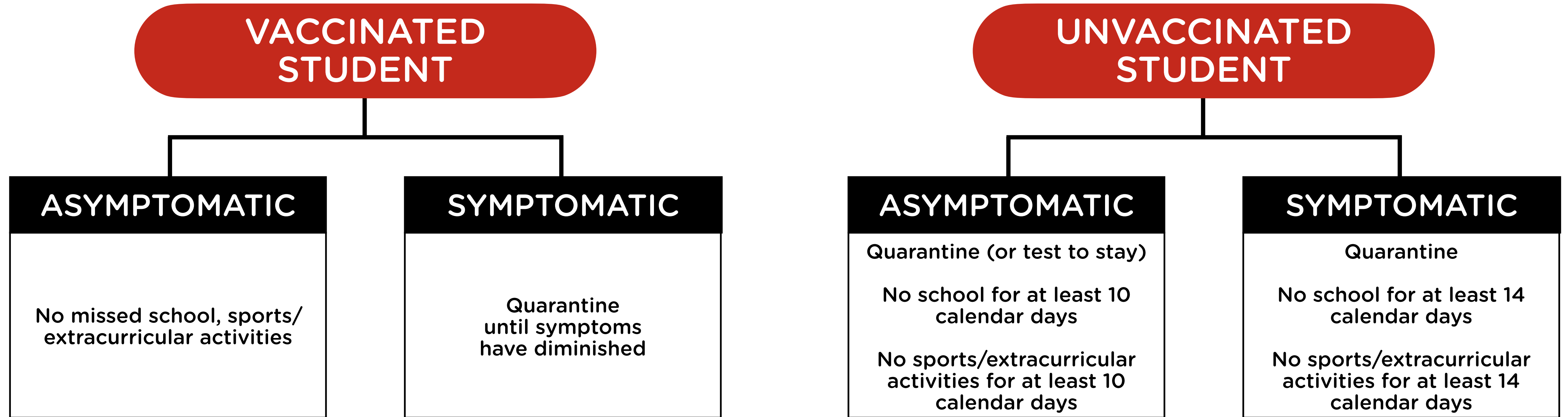

Grades 7-12 How do we get there?

Post-Executive Order	Metrics	Reduced Mitigation
Universal Masking 	5 or more person-to-person transmissions in a school	Universal Masking 
Universal Masking 	Less than 5 person-to-person transmissions in a school and/or X% of students vaccinated	Situational Masking 
Universal Masking 	No person-to-person transmissions in a school for a 4-week period and/or X% of students vaccinated	Recommended, Not Required Masking
