Non-Barrington 220/Out of District Students:

Non-Barrington 220 Students, newly enrolled in a Barrington 220 school for the Fall:

Once the student is enrolled for the following school year, the student may register for summer school. On-line registration will be available within 24 hours of registration.

Non-Barrington 220 Students Living in District 220 Boundaries, NOT Attending a Barrington 220 school in the Fall:

Students are eligible to take classes.

Registration will be from May 7th-June 1st.

Non-Barrington 220 Student NOT Living in District 220 Boundaries:

Students are eligible to take classes with Summer School Principal Permission. Registration will be from May 29-June 3. Please call Karen Jasonowicz, by appointment only 847.842.3512, to register. The following

must be submitted at the time of registration in order to confirm the seat in the course:

4. An additional, **one time** out of district fee of \$50 per student, needs to be included with the payment.

Where:

Barbara Rose Elementary, Roslyn Road Elementary, Prairie Middle School Campus, ELC, and Barrington High School.

Registration:

Registration will take place at each student's Annual Review.

Tuition:

Students must be identified as eligible for Extended School Year (ESY) Summer School at the Individual Education Program (IEP) Conference/Annual Review. Requests for related services will be considered at the Annual Review. There is no cost to parents for the Extended School Year Summer School.

Transportation:

Transportation will be provided only for eligible special education students of CUSD 220.

FAQ

Does the district provide transportation?

Parents/students are responsible for transportation to and from school. Transportation will be provided for qualified participants.

What determines if a class will be cancelled?

You will be notified if a class is cancelled. It is important to have an alternative plan if a class is cancelled. The district reserves the right to cancel any courses which do not meet enrollment requirements or if unable to secure a certified instructor.

Health Information

What do I need to provide the nurse's office?

Students entering grades 6-8 that were enrolled in a District 220 school during 2018/19 have records on file. Teachers have access to students' health conditions and emergency health plans. Please update the summer school nurse if there are any changes. School Board Policy 7:100 requires the most recent physical and immunization record must be on file.

If a student was not enrolled in a District 220 school, they will need to fill out an Emergency Health Form. Please notify the nurse if your child has an Emergency or Health Plan in place at his/her present school. If you are not enrolled at CUSD 220 you must submit a health form, immunization record and recent physical with your registration.

Nurse Notes:

Does your child have Asthma, Food or Bee Allergy, or other Health Conditions?

- Please remember that if your child has an Inhaler or Epi-Pen that they carry at school they must notify the Summer School Nurse.
- Children prescribed an Inhaler or Epi-Pen should have them available during summer school in case of an emergency.
- Appropriate medication forms should be on file.
- Students may need an Emergency Care Plan (ECP) developed by the school nurse to be shared with teachers and coaches that have a need to know.
- Contact the School Nurse if you have any concerns regarding your child's health status during summer school.

FINE ARTS

INTRODUCTION TO SCREENWRITING & PRODUCTION

1st Session Only (8:15am-10:30am)

LITERACY

During this class we will read, respond, reflect, write, and enjoy all aspects of the workshop model and help you prepare for your middle school year ahead!

LITERACY THROUGH SPORTS

Incoming 6th grade: 1st Session Only (8:15am-10:30am)

Incoming 7th and 8th grade: 2nd Session Only (10:45am-1:00pm)

This course will combine the participation in athletics, as well as reading and writing about a specific sport each week. The first half of the class will be spent reading and researching about a sport's history, its athletes, and its future. Student will be researching and writing a column pertaining to the selected sport by the end of each week. The second half of class will be spent playing a sport. Not only will we be working on literacy skills, but improving our fitness at the same time! Sports are not guaranteed but suggestions include baseball, softball, basketball, kickball, boot camp and fitness exercise.

READING ACADEMY

Open to grades 6-8

This class is designed to help students strengthen their ability to understand texts through various reading comprehension strategies. Students will learn how to decipher meanings of new vocabulary words through context clues, then use that word knowledge to help strengthen their overall comprehension and reading recall. Students will be taught reading strategies they can apply to various texts. This class is designed to help boost comprehension so students can read and understand texts with ease. Note: Enrollment in this class is primarily based on teacher recommendation.

SUMMER READ/ REBECCA CAUDILL CHALLENGE- LITERACY WORKSHOP

Open to grades 6-8

Students will enjoy an environment submersed in literacy workshop while reading titles from past and present Rebecca Caudill lists along with their teacher required summer read novel. The elements of fiction, figurative language, vocabulary study, journal reflection writing, and literary projects using technology will be implemented.

YA EPIC READS: YOUNG ADULT LIT

Open to grades 6-8

"If you don't like to read, you haven't found the right book." — J.K. Rowling

Often times those that aren't fond of reading simply haven't stumbled upon the right series, author, or genre. Just like movies or music, we all have specific preferences. Come join us on a journey to discover your new favorite book! Explore academic vocabulary, common root words, prefixes, and suffixes, and advanced punctuation and grammar through popular young adult novels such as *The Hunger Games*, *Divergent*, and *Matched*. Students will practice personal choice in the selection of their novels with teacher guidance to be sure that the content and reading level are appropriate. All are welcome -- reluctant and avid readers alike!

MATH

INTRO TO 6TH GRADE MATH

Open to incoming 6th graders

This class is suitable for students with strong 5th grade foundational skills. The class will assist students in establishing math skills in basic math concepts and pre-algebra, focusing on Math in Focus strategies used in fifth grade.

INTRO TO 7TH GRADE MATH

Open to incoming 7th graders

This class is suitable for students with strong 6th grade foundational skills. The class will assist students in establishing math skills in basic math concepts and pre-algebra, focusing on the connected mathematics curriculum (CMP3).

INTRO TO 8TH GRADE MATH

Open to incoming 8th graders

This class is suitable for students with strong 7th grade foundational skills. The class will assist students in establishing math skills in basic math concepts and pre-algebra, continuing to build upon the connected mathematics strategies curriculum (CMP3).

REAL WORLD MATH FOR INCOMING 7th GRADE

Open to incoming 7th graders

1st Session Only (8:15am-10:30am)

This course is designed to provide students with a solid foundation of 6th grade math skills in order to better prepare them for 7th grade math concepts. Instruction will be based on each student's strengths in math, and will address specific areas in need of strengthening.
